

Wed., Jan 26, 1842

Joseph, the prophet, under this date journalized as follows:  
"I rode out to borrow money to refund for money borrowed of  
John Banlew.....read in the Book of Mormon in the evening.  
Wrote a long letter to Edward, West Nantmeal on temporal  
business.

13 Sept 1842

Tuesday September 13, Joseph the Prophet spent the day  
at home and settled with Edward Hunter.

Tuesday, November 26. Joseph the prophet met in the council  
with his Brother Hyrum Williard Richards, and others concern-  
ing bankruptcy. In the afternoon he attended court at the trial of  
Mr. Hunter, before Alderman Spencer for slander. Joseph forgave  
Hunter the judgement, and he was freed. \$10 for contempt of  
court.

Monday, February 3, 1845

The following city officers were elected in Nauvoo without a  
dissenting vote. (about 900 votes polled)

Mayor: Orson Spencer

Alderman: Daniel Spencer, Newel K. Whitney, George W. Harris  
and Charles C. rich

Councillors:

David Fullmer, John Park, George Miller, W.W. Phelps,  
John C. Writht, Samuel Bent, Phinehas Richards, James  
Sloan and Edward Hunter

Saturday, November 15, 1851

An election was held in Great Salt Lake City at which Orson  
Pratt and Edward Hunter were elected counselors and John Brown  
a representative from Great Salt Lake County to the Utah  
Legislation.
