Dear Mr. Pratt:


With reference to your kind letter of June 4, requesting further information regarding my son, you are advised that I appreciate your consideration in making inquiry in his behalf; but I realize that with the adverse conditions as at present, it is really asking too much to expect any more from you than the inquiries already made. I would suggest, in view of these conditions, that the matter be allowed to go on until such time as employment conditions improve, when, if you should learn of any openings, I should be glad to hear of the same.

As stated in my previous letter, Winfield has not specialized in electrical engineering, but his course in civil engineering has included considerable electrical work. He attended the University of Utah part of the time and the Utah State Agricultural College the remainder and obtained his degree from the latter college. His reasons for changing to the latter college were due to his conclusions that the course there is really more complete, that more careful individual attention is given by the professors to the students, and that there is a finer spirit in the school.

As stated to you previously, his purpose in taking engineering was to obtain a broad, thorough course upon which he might build for the future, and he is not expecting to confine his efforts solely to engineering work.
