Sylvester Q. Cannon, L.D.S. Leader, Dies

Long Service Closes

Member Of Council Of Twelve Mourned By Church

Sylvester Q. Cannon Dies After Five Years as LDS Apostle

Sylvester Q. Cannon, 65, member of the L.D.S. council of twelve apostles, president of the Deseret News Publishing Company, died in a Lake hospital at 1:25 p. m. Saturday following a lingering illness.

Water Engineering His engineering work included direction of the Weber river land and irrigation survey for the state engineers from 1905 to 1907, water supply engineer for Salt Lake City, 1912 to 1913, and city engineer from 1913 to 1925, during which major works projects amounting to \$11,000,000 were completed.

A brilliant career of Church service came to an end today in the death at a local hospital of Elder Sylvester Q. Cannon, 65, a member of the Council of the Twelve Apostles of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Into the span of his lifetime Elder Cannon has crowded a wide variety of Church service. He has held among other positions the office of Presiding Bishop of the Church, president of the Pioneer Stake, counselor in the stake presidency and president of the Netherlands-Belgium Mission.

Death Closes Career Of Noted LDS Leader

The death of Sylvester Q. Cannon will be felt as a distinct loss to his church, which he served faithfully, but to the entire community in the life of which he played an important part for many years. Born in Salt Lake City, June 10, 1877, the son of George Q. Cannon and Elizabeth Hoagland Cannon, he spent most of his life here, with the exception of several years abroad doing missionary work for the LDS church.

Prominent Church Officials to Talk At Wednesday Rites

David O. McKay of the LDS church first presidency and other prominent church officials will be speakers Wednesday at 12:15 p. m. at funeral services for Sylvester Q. Cannon, member of the council of twelve apostles, who died Saturday after a long illness.

Lower Decoration

His leadership and ability had been recognized in a number of civic appointments. In 1908 he was chairman of the Governor's State Flood Control Commission and in 1931-32 he acted as chairman of the state advisory council for unemployment.

Presiding Bishop

June 11, 1925, he was ordained and set apart as presiding bishop. At the 108th annual conference of the L.D.S. church in 1933, Mr. Cannon was made an associate member of the council of twelve apostles.

Former Chairman of Board

A former chairman of the board of trustees of the L.D.S. hospital, he also served as past president of the church first presidency.

Cannon, Los Angeles, Cal.; Lieutenant Lawrence Cannon, U. S. medical corps in Texas; Julian S. Cannon and Private Donald James Cannon of Salt Lake City, and 11 grandchildren.
