Elder Cannon, with Mrs. Cannon and several church leaders and missionaries, yesterday conducted an annual tour of inspection of the city. He spoke last night at a meeting in Hotel Abraham Lincoln.

The group is making an annual tour of the Northern States mission, which comprises Illinois, Ohio, Wisconsin, Indiana and Iowa.

In his talk last night at the hotel, Elder Cannon, answering a question of "Why doesn't the Lord stop war?" stated:


"All men have the right to choose between right and wrong. The Lord does not interfere, but he does hold men responsible for their deeds"

During the informal talk yester-day afternoon Elder Cannon explained that by raising foods and working for themselves members of the church are able to remove many of their followers from federal dole.

The visitor said that due to the war in Europe the church has recalled most of its missionaries from foreign fields.

The group will leave today for Indiana.
