Testimony Of Leader Lauded By Speaker

As at the three previous conference meetings the fourth session saw a congregation on hand which filled the Tabernacle to capacity, all available standing room being taken.

The session was conducted by President J. Reuben Clark Jr.

The opening song by the congregation was, "We Thank Thee Oh God For A Prophet".

Music was again furnished by the Blackfoot Stake Choir under the direction of Ronald Bitton. After the opening prayer by President M. Ezra Sorensen of the Bannock Stake, the choir sang "Praise The Lord, O Jerusalem" by Maunder.

Elder Sylvester Q. Cannon of the Council of the Twelve was the first speaker of the session.

PAYS TRIBUTE

He declared the testimony of Pres. Heber J. Grant is a source of inspiration to the Latter-day Saints. He said he was greatly impressed with the testimony of the President and also with his life and accomplishments.

President Grant has been diligent and faithful in this responsibility and has lived up to every duty and requirement of his high office and calling. He has fulfilled in every respect every calling of his position and every Latter-day Saint should rejoice in his testimony and accomplishments, he declared.

Elder Cannon said every man must give an accounting for his actions upon this earth. Every Latter-day Saint has therefore the responsibility to do that which is right.

MUST WATCH ACTION

The speaker said mankind can be led to do good or can be led to do evil and this is an important principle in their lives. The way we live and the desires we have are important factors in our lives, he said. We should be able to discern that which is right and that which is wrong.

Elder Cannon declared mankind should learn to control the influences in their lives which come from their natural appetites and their emotions. He said man has the power, if he lives for it, to understand the principles of the Gospel and know the difference between that which is good and that which is not for our welfare.

He declared mankind should know the importance of keeping the commandments of the Lord and show their love for the Gospel. He urged all to live close to the Lord, seek to know His will and love the Lord and keep His commandments.

He testified in conclusion that the Church is engaged in the work of the Lord and that Joseph Smith was a prophet of God.
