 shall share alike. I have also given by my will the sum of  
 twenty pounds the just residue of my property being the same I have  
 situated in the township of Manhattan joining lands of the late John  
 Joseph Stoo's the township line road between the lot of ground  
 purchased of William Beaumont. I also give by my will to my son  
 Edward a certain lot of ground situate on the East side of Delaware  
 street between Church & Cass streets in the City of Philadelphia  
 the same that I purchased from John Penn containing in front  
 twenty and six and in length ninety five feet bounded by other ground  
 of mine ground late of Jacob Prince & the said lot of ground four  
 hundred Dollars my eight day clock I give the same to my son  
 his heirs and assigns forever. I have also given by my will  
 five Daughters Rebecca Peckin, Margaret Hunt, Alice Long  
 Hunt & Elizabeth Hunt their heirs & assigns forever all the rest  
 residue & remainder of my Estate Real Personal & mixed to be equally  
 divided between them the said Rebecca, Margaret, Alice, Hunt  
 & Elizabeth. Lastly I nominate constitute and appoint my  
 William Hunt my two sons in law Peter Peckin & Thomas Long  
 Executors of this my Last Will. In witness whereof I the said  
 Edward Hunt have to this my Last Will and Testament signed  
 sealed & dated the nineteenth day of the month of September  
 hundred and seven 1817.

 as his Last Will & Testament that at the doing thereof  
 he was of a sound disposing mind & memory to the best of their  
 knowledge & belief

Same day Letters Testamentary were granted to William Hunt  
 Peter Peckin and Thomas Long the Executors in the foregoing Testament  
 named they having been first affirmed in due form of Law

lands goods chattels & personal Estate so have ever I given my  
dear & beloved wife and I make and ordain her my true wife & heir  
of this my will for her use & sustenance & to dispose of as she shall see

July 5. 1807 Then personally appeared George Palmer & William Peters  
being affirmed according to Law did respectively declare & say that they  
are well acquainted with the handwriting of Jonathan Sturges  
the testator in the above will & have often seen him write  
that they do verily believe that the name Jonathan Sturges the said  
subscriber as also the whole of the writing of the said will is of the proper  
handwriting of the said Jonathan Sturges

Saturday the 21st of August 1807 was granted to Sarah Sturges the  
Security of the foregoing Testament name & having been first off  
in due form of Law

July 22<sup>nd</sup> 1807 I do hereby certify that I Edward Hunt of the  
Township of Newton in the County of Delaware State of Pennsylvania being  
of sound memory & understanding thank God for the same that  
his mercies do make I publish this my last will & testament in manner  
following that is to say I first will that all my just debts and  
General Expenses be fully paid & satisfied by my Executors hereinafter named  
I then give devise and bequeath to my son William Hunt the whole  
end of my plantation which he now lies on & situate in the Township of  
Newton joining lands of the heirs of Robert Mendlingfall & being  
situated between the lands of Van Stankin & others with the house & buildings  
thereon & the buildings appertaining thereto. The division line between  
end of my plantation & the part I have after disposed of to be given at the corner  
the meadow on the East side of the house he now lives in near the corner  
bearing from thence by a straight line north the first & last fence dividing the  
said meadow & the meadow that I occupy to the place where the  
meadow fence joins Van Stankin's line computed to be about one hundred  
and fifty acres by the same more or less I give the same to my son  
son William Hunt his heirs & assigns forever he paying one shilling  
he paid to my first daughter Sarah Rebecca Beckwith & her heirs  
the sum of one hundred & fifty dollars to my daughter Elizabeth Hunt in one year after my death
