Briefly describe the principal buildings, noting additions and alterations and their dates, and associated outbuildings and structures.

Built in two phases with distinct styling in each, this stuccoed house provides an example of the marriage of the Greek Revival and Italianate styles. The original or south portion (ca. 1875) was originally built as a one story hall-parlor house with Greek Revival detail. Its gable roof is articulated by a continuous cornice and frieze which terminate in cornice returns at the gable end.

The northern 2 story portion of the house (ca. 1885), built in the Italianate style, is capped by a truncated hipped roof which in turn is crowned by a bracketed upper cornice and cast-iron railing. The main cornice where roof and wall intersect is detailed with paired brackets on a continuous cornice and frieze which wrap the perimeter of the structure. Other features common to the Italianate style are the tall proportioned windows which are capped by bracketed hoods, and the ornate bay window which features carved panels, bracketed eaves, and a concave mansard-type roof.

At the rear of the house, a wood frame addition built sometime around 1930 supplements the two original wings. Alterations to the structure are limited to the covered porch whose original wood columns have been replaced by octagonally shaped steel columns (ca. 1980).

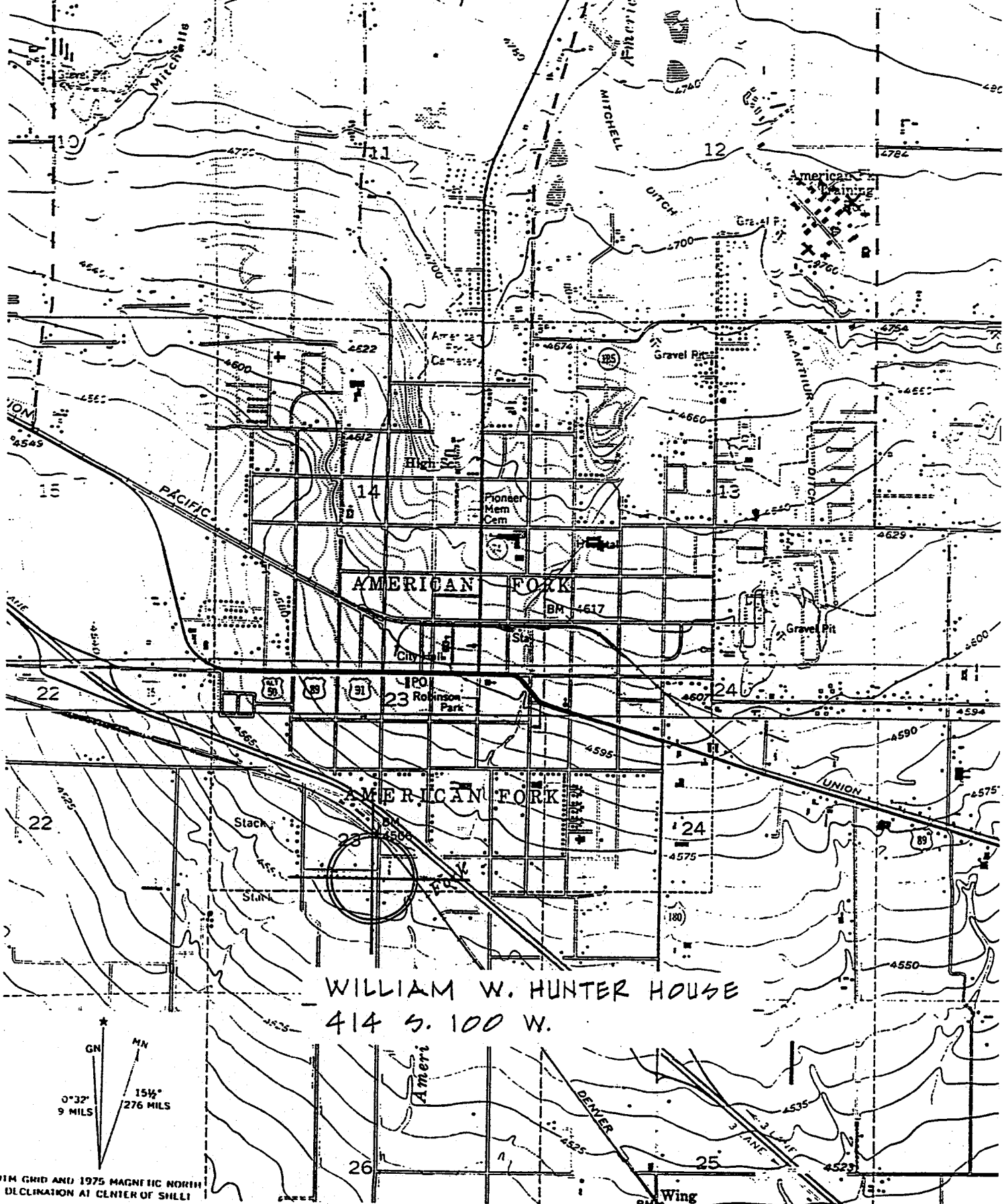
Write a chronological history of the property, focusing primarily on the original or principal owners & significant events.

Purchased by William H. Hunter in 1883 upon his return from a mission, this property likely already contained the hall-parlor house previously described. Hunter, who had a family of 2 children by this time, is said to have been a farmer and stock grower by occupation. In the decade following Hunter's acquisition of the property, the two story north addition was likely built to house the ever increasing Hunter family which had reached 7 by 1890, and eventually 11 by the turn of the century.

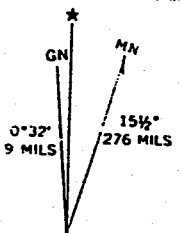
William Hunter was active in both civic and religious circles having served as city councilman, mayor, and ward bishop. Upon his death in 1934, and that of his wife, Rachel Greenwood in 1935, ownership of the property was transferred to Alice Hunter Jensen, daughter. In 1940 the property was acquired by Claude and Annie Burch. The current owners are Clifford and Emily Wood who are currently in the process of restoring the house.





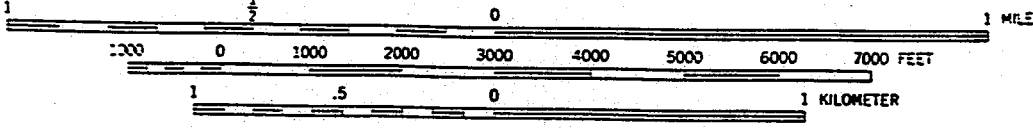


WILLIAM W. HUNTER HOUSE

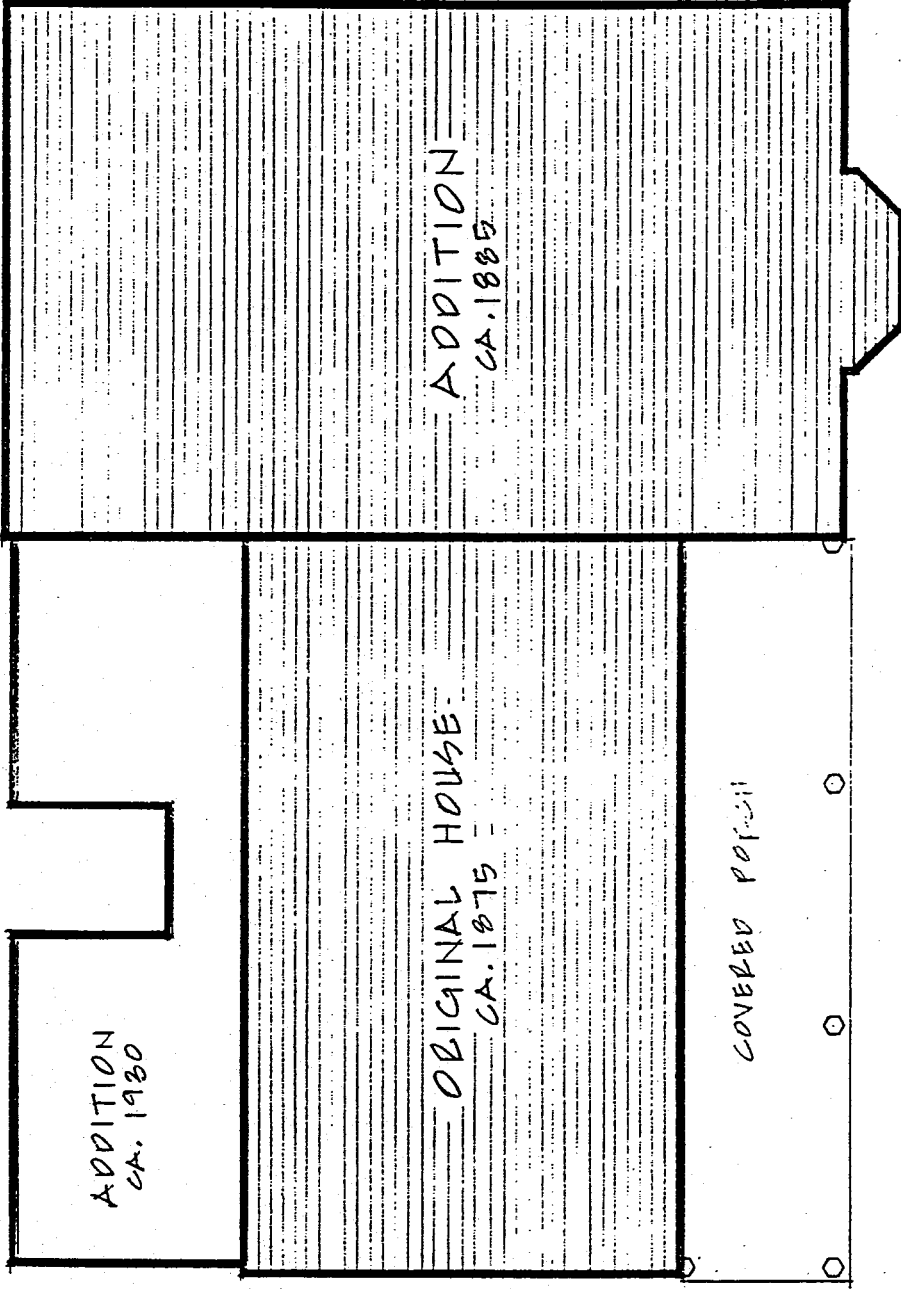

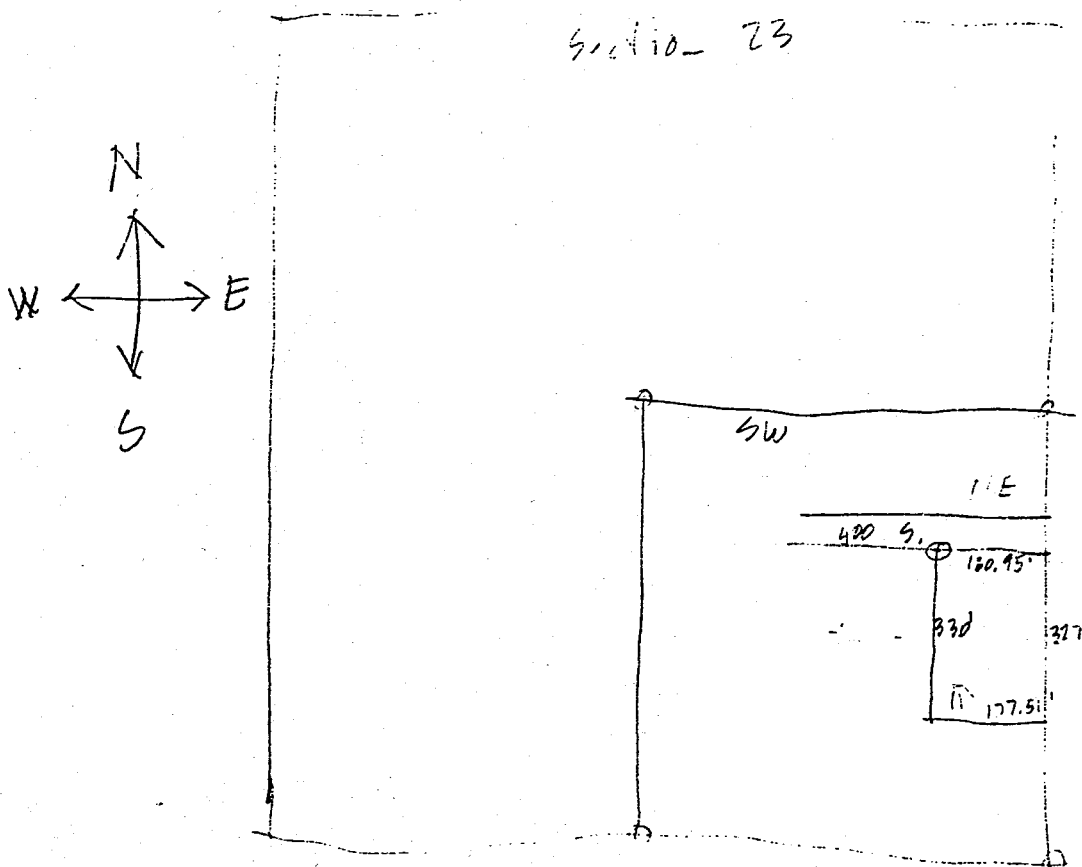

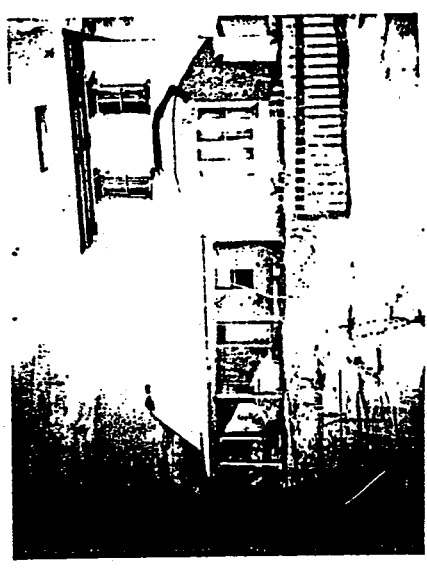

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# American Fork

## Pioneer *Des Nevs* *May 25,* *1934* Dies

William W. Hunter, prominent Utah county farmer and stock grower, former mayor of American Fork and for many years a ward bishop there, died yesterday at his



American Fork home. He was a son of the late Edward Hunter for many years presiding bishop of the Church.

Mr. Hunter was born in Salt Lake, April 4, 1851, and married Rachael Greenwood, sister of the late Judge Joshua Greenwood.

Mr. Hunter Throughout his life he had been active in agricultural, civic and Church affairs in Utah county.

Surviving besides his widow are six sons: Ernest G., of American Fork; Wallace G., of Salt Lake; Joseph G., of Burlingame, Cal., a member of the state railroad commission of that state; John G., of Long Beach, and David C., of Salt Lake; also three daughters, Mrs. E. A. Jensen of Salt Lake; Mrs. L. Werner Floyd of Tooele, and Mrs. Clara Crittendon of Los Angeles.

Funeral services will be held Sunday at 2 p.m. at the Second ward chapel at American Fork, followed by burial in the cemetery.

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## Rachel Greenwood Hunter

**AMERICAN FORK**—Mrs. Rachel Greenwood Hunter, 73, widow of William Hunter, died suddenly in Los Angeles, Cal., Thursday at 11 p. m. of a heart attack.

She was born February 23, 1860, in American Fork, a daughter of William and Alice Houghton Greenwood, early settlers, her father being the first school teacher of this city.

Mrs. Hunter recalled the activities of the Indians. During her early married life, when her husband was serving an L. D. S. mission to England, leaving her with a large farm and two minor children to care for, she was often frightened out of her home by the demands of the Indians, despite the two guns she kept loaded for protection.

Mrs. Hunter was active in the L. D. S. church, being a teacher in the Primary and the Relief society when American Fork had only one ward. For many years she was a member of the old Alpine stake board, and chaplain of the Daughters of the Utah Pioneers for four years.

Surviving are nine sons and daughters: Dave Hunter and Mrs. E. A. Jensen, Salt Lake City; Ernest Hunter, American Fork; Wallace Hunter, San Francisco, Cal.; Joseph Hunter, Burlingame, Cal.; Albert Hunter, Chicago, Ill.; John Hunter, Long Beach, Cal.; Mrs. W. H. Floyd, Tooele; Mrs. L. H. Grittenden, Los Angeles, Cal.; a brother, Samuel Greenwood, American Fork; a half-brother, Owen Greenwood, Montana; two half-sisters, Emily Webster, Los Angeles, and Lottie Hansen, Palo Alto, Cal.

Funeral services will be conducted Sunday at 2 p. m. in the American Fork Second ward chapel, with Bishop Joseph H. Storrs officiating. The body may be viewed from 10 a. m. until time for the services Sunday at the family residence. Interment will be in the City cemetery under the direction of Anderson Brothers' mortuary.

Considerable trouble was experienced at this time owing to the sale of intoxicants, and on January 12th, an ordinance was passed prohibiting the manufacture, selling or giving away of spirituous, vinous or fermented liquors.

February 4. Steps were taken by the City Council to have the legislature amend the City Charter giving the city more power concerning the impounding and disposing of cattle, regarding the location of telegraph poles, railroad depots, etc.

April 1. A recommendation made by Stephen Mott in behalf of the committee of eleven recommending that \$1000 of the surplus water of American Fork creek, was appropriated to take care of the surplus water on the north side of South Street (now Second South) to take water into Spring Creek.

Considerable trouble was experienced this spring in taking care of surplus water. Pleasant Grove refused to take surplus water. The matter was referred to the Bishops of Alpine, American Fork and Pleasant Grove.

Some damage was done to the lower lands by flood waters and damage claims of W. H. Chipman, Neils Christensen and others were filed. The matter was later referred to A. O. Smoot, W. N. Dusenberry and a third party to be selected by them.

May 25, 1884. A resolution was passed putting American Fork on Standard time.

October 2. Alderman Cunningham reported on the decision of Water Commissioners. In the case of Pleasant Grove, an award had been made after the 20th of September of each year until the 15th day of April of 2/7 of 2/3 of the whole creek. Lehi, an award of 1/6 of said stream between the 20th day of September and the 1st day of December of each year.

#### ADMINISTRATION 1885-1886

Mayor, Oscar F. Hunter; aldermen—George Cunningham and James E. Steele; councilmen—James Gardner, William W. Hunter and Ammon Mercer; Eugene A. Henriod, recorder.

During this term of office, James E. Steele and George Cunningham resigned, and John McNeil and Samuel Deann were appointed to succeed them.

February 18, 1885. The decision of the Presidency of Utah Stake in the matter of the surplus waters of American Fork Creek concerning American Fork, Pleasant Grove and Lehi cities, was read and was in substance as follows:

Lehi and Pleasant Grove required to enlarge their respective canals to take care of water awarded them by the County Commissioners and open up waste ditches to carry the same into Utah Lake when not needed for irrigation or otherwise distributed; also to pay in labor, material or otherwise to open and keep the old channel of American Fork Creek. Lehi 1/6 of the whole expense and Pleasant Grove 1/7 of 2/3, to entitle them

August, 1920. The Jane Robinson property was purchased for a city park for the sum of \$4,000.

March 20, 1921. The city purchased the East School property for a Camp ground from the School board for \$500.

May 28, 1921. Attorney William H. Folland made claim for American Fork City in behalf of E. H. Street for \$700, for damage to property by flood waters, in May, 1920. Referred Attorney and Recorder to answer.

June 20, 1921. Arrangements were made with the Band to give weekly concerts; members of band to be paid per member for each practice, and \$1.50 per member for band concert. \$164.50 was contributed by the business Estimated expense, \$180.00.

An ordinance was passed relinquishing all rights and of American Fork City to regulate, distribute or control for irrigation, or to control or regulate ditches or other means conveying irrigation or waste water within or without American Fork City, and repealing chapter 59 of the Revised Ordinances of American Fork City passed Dec. 31, 1919.

September 24. Dr. P. M. Kelly and W. S. Chipman in the council that \$10,000 would be forthcoming from the Carnegie Library Board for the erection of a public library building on condition that the city pass a resolution guaranteeing \$10,000 year for maintenance and on Sept. 28 a resolution was passed with the necessary guarantee. The contract for the building was let April 4, 1922, to the Chipman Mercantile Company; Treganza & Cannon, architects.

#### JESSE M. WALKER ADMINISTRATION (SECOND TERM) 1922-1923

Mayor, Jesse M. Walker; councilmen—Reed Roberts, Thomas A. Barratt, Thomas Coddington, Benjamin F. Madsen and H. S. Rasmussen; recorder, George F. Shelley; treasurer, Mary E. Abel; marshal, Walter F. Durrant; city justice, W. Hunter.

During this administration the budget system was adopted. Walter Adams, in behalf of the Utah Valley Gas & Electric Company, asked for a franchise for the extension of the gas system to American Fork. Franchise granted August 12, 1922.

March 14. Council accepted with thanks the offer of the Bank of American Fork to install an electric clock on the corner of Main and Center Streets.
