4 ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

Built ca. 1870, this 1 1/2 story hall-parlor house was built in the classical tradition with Greek Revival detailing. Capped by a gable roof, detailed with a frieze, cornice, and cornice returns, the 18" thick adobe walls rest on a stone foundation which has been coated by concrete. The main facade is a bilaterally symmetrical design with a central door and gabled dormer above, which is flanked on either side by window openings on the main level. Original windows, which appear to have been two over two double hung assemblies, with pedimental window heads, have been removed or greatly altered. All window openings on the main elevation have been enlarged and all original detailing removed. Detailing is largely intact on only one window - the south upper floor. The front of the house is graced by a neo-classically influenced hip roof porch which employs round tuscan columns, pilasters, and an entablature. The porch appears to date from about 1905.

A wood frame addition on a concrete foundation was built on the rear of the house ca. 1936 at which time the original stairway was removed and relocated to this area. A dormer was also added at the rear of the house which provided head space at the top of the new stairway. The addition is sheathed with wood drop siding and the wide overhang is supported by arch brackets.

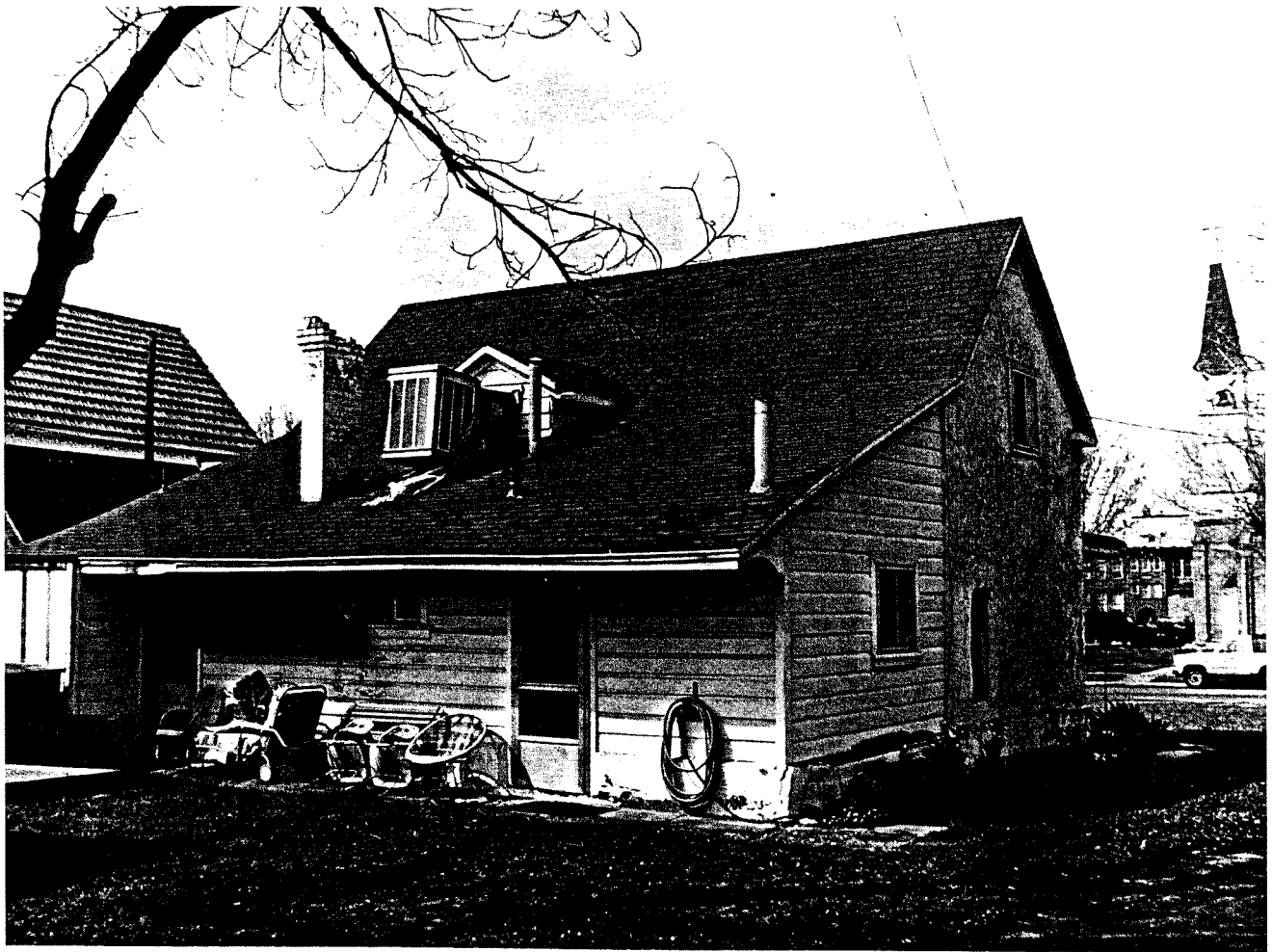

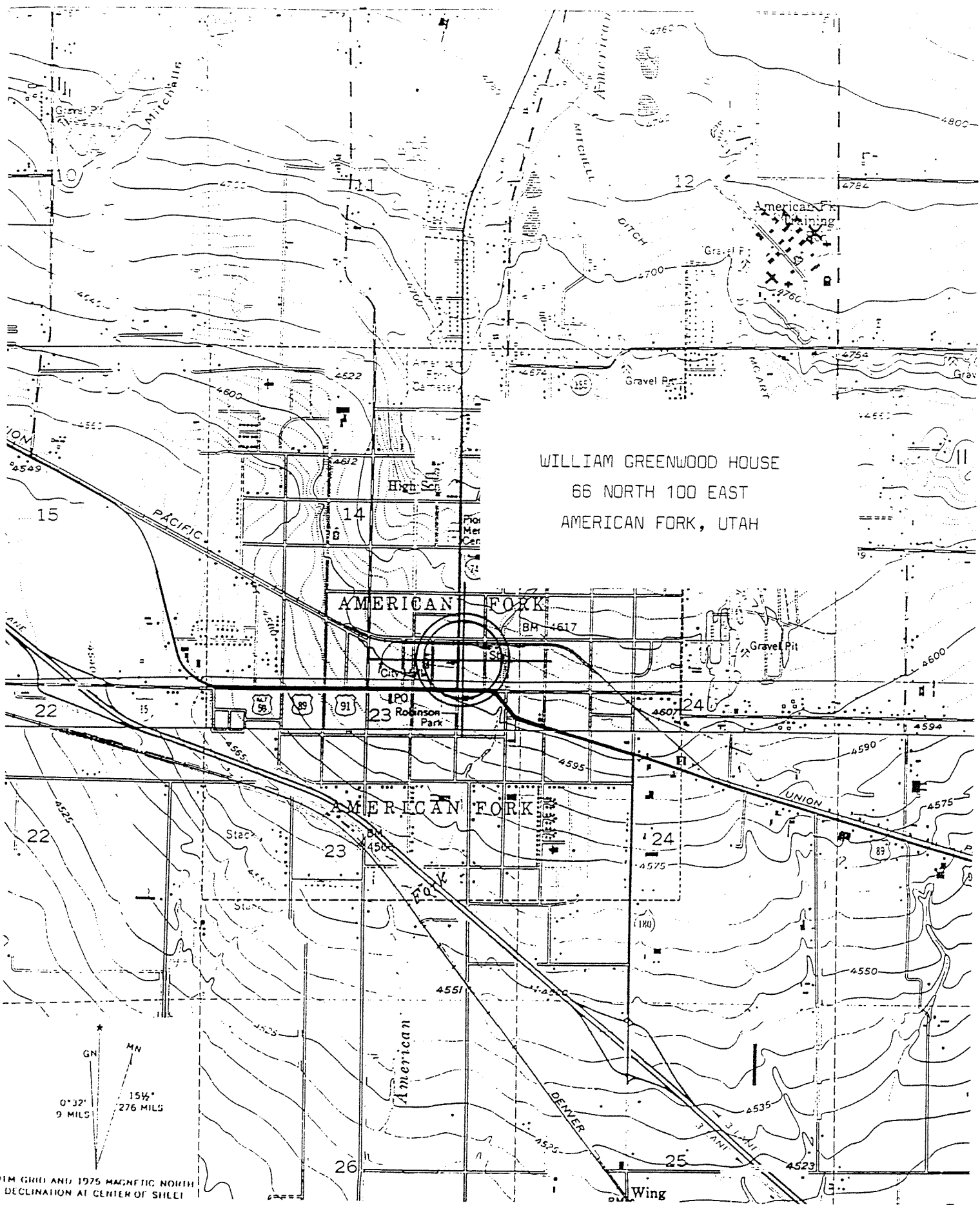

Land records indicate that this property was originally deeded in 1870 to William Greenwood, an original settler of American Fork, who had arrived 19 years earlier in 1857. The history of William Greenwood is well documented since he kept detailed journals of his life. An attempt here will be made only to summarize major life occurrences. His life appears worthy of more detailed historical analysis.

William Greenwood Summary:

Born in Burnley, Lancashire, England in 1912. Father a merchant miller. Conversion to Mormonism, 1840, banished from home. Emigration to U.S., to Nauvoo, 1842. Sicknes, blessing, visitation of an angel. Mission, 1842. Marriage to Alice Houghton, 1843, 14 children. Death of father, return to England for inheritance of \$5000.00. Return to U.S., to Davenport, Iowa. Wife's parents oppose the church. Move to Nauvoo,

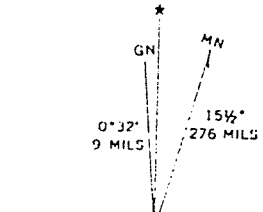

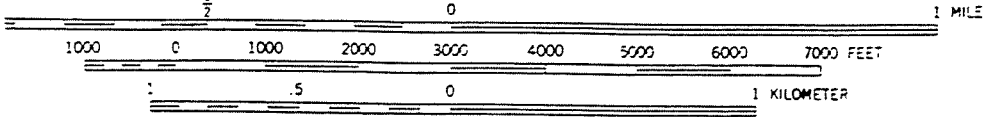

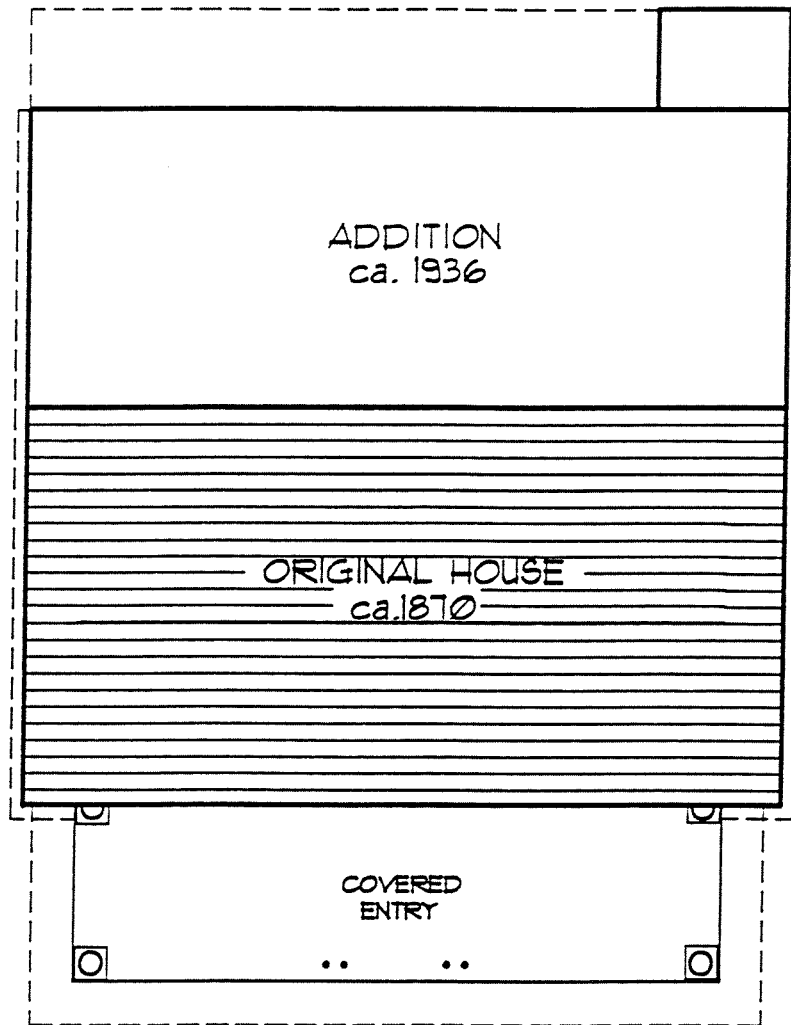

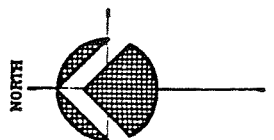

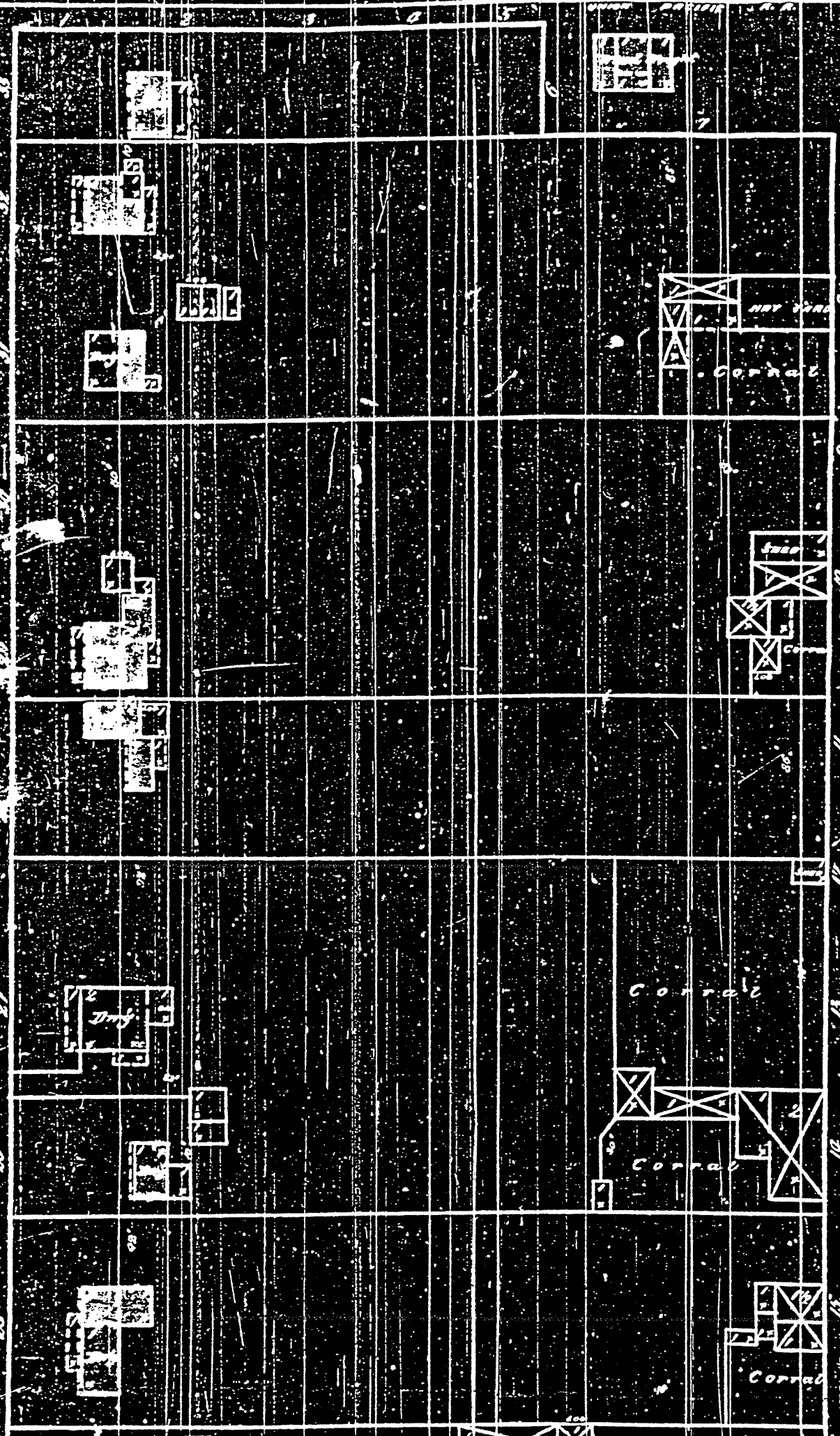

Adella b. June 27, 1867, m. Charles H. Hart; Franklin b. July 13, 1870, m. Frances Thomas. Family home Willard, Utah, and Bloomington, Idaho.

Settled first at Willard, Utah; served in Echo Canyon war 1857; moved to Bloomington, Idaho, 1853. Served two years as 1st counselor to president of elders' quorum at Willard; Feb. 8, 1858, ordained a seventy and set apart a president of 59th quorum, which position he held until Aug. 26, 1877, when he was ordained a high priest and set apart as a member of high council of Bear Lake stake, holding this position about 20 years; superintendent Bloomington Sunday school 1871-1909; choir leader 35 years. Director and secretary Bloomington Co-op. store 35 years. Farmer and stock-raiser.

GREENHALGH, PETER, JR. (son of Peter Greenhalgh and Sarah Heald). Born Nov. 9, 1865, Willard, Utah.

Married Rebecca A. Welker Sept. 29, 1881, at Salt Lake City (daughter of James W. Welker and Annie Pugh, pioneers 1852). She was born Jan. 24, 1864, at Willard. Their children: Sarah Annie b. GREENHALGH, THOMAS (son of William Greenhalgh, born Jan. 12, 1790, and Margret Greenhalgh, born Feb. 10, 1792, both at Swinton, near Manchester, Lancashire, Eng.). He was born Jan. 15, 1821, Worsley, Lancashire. Came to Utah Oct. 6, 1866, Joseph S. Rawlins company.

Married Mary Morecroft Sept. 26, 1847, Eccles, Eng. (daughter of James Morecroft and Hannah Downing of Macclesfield, near Manchester). She was born Feb. 24, 1827. Their children were: Mary Ann, m. George Mace; Sarah, m. James L. Newton; Martha, died; Abraham, m. Maria Nelsena Henriksen; Thomas, m. Elizabeth Greenhalgh; Margaret Alice, m. William Wallace Billings; William, m. Jolley; Frances, d. child; Ruth Elizabeth, m. Charles S. Cram; George, m. Elizabeth Mackleprang. Family home Washington, Washington Co., Utah.

Married Harriet Wardle 1873 at Salt Lake City, who came to Utah 1872 from Lancashire, Eng. Their children were Thomas John; Henry; Esther.

Home missionary England 1840-65. High priest and ward teacher. Settled first in Sugar House ward, Salt Lake City, moving to Washington, Utah, in 1867, where he took charge of weaving department of Brigham Young cotton factory. Died May 2, 1882.

GREENHALGH, ABRAHAM (son of Thomas Greenhalgh and Mary Morecroft). He was born April 12, 1855, Manchester, Eng. Came to Utah with father.

Married Maria Nelsena Henriksen March 9, 1882, at Salt Lake City (daughter of Peter Henriksen and Jacobine Ernst of Velle, Denmark, latter came to Utah July 12, 1872, Anthon H. Lund company). She was born Jan. 18, 1862, came to Utah with mother. Their children: Ernest Abraham b. Feb. 26, 1883, m. Hazel Adams; Thomas Charles b. Oct. 14, 1884; Leo Morecroft b. July 17, 1887; Earl Henriksen b. April 11, 1891; Erma Mary b. Feb. 28, 1896; Jacobine b. Jan. 30, 1931, died.

Worked in cotton mill under father at Washington, Utah; moved to Kanab, Utah, 1873, and to Provo 1875, where he worked in Provo Woolen Mills until 1895. Settled at Schofield, Utah, 1899, where he engaged in the mercantile business, serving also as postmaster 1901-09; justice of the peace; town councilman. President of deacons' quorum; Sunday school and ward teacher; high priest; 2nd counselor in Schofield bishopric 1904-12, becoming first counselor Jan. 17, 1912.

GREENWOOD, WILLIAM (son of Robison Greenwood of Yorkshire, born 1782, and Elizabeth Cryer, born 1784, both at Burnley, Eng.). He was born Aug. 7, 1822, at Burnley. Came to Utah Oct. 28, 1847.

GREENWOOD, JOSHUA (son of William Greenwood and Alice Houghton). Born July 29, 1860, at American Fork, Utah.

Married Josephine Payne Jan. 18, 1883, Salt Lake City (daughter of Joseph Payne and Harriet McBride), who was born May 25, 1861, Fillmore, Utah. Their children: Marian J. b. Oct. 24, 1883, m. GREENWOOD, WILLIAM (son of William Greenwood and Sarah Hartley of Burnley, Eng., and Warsaw, Hancock county, Ill.). Born March 4, 1819, at Hepinstall, Eng. Came to Utah 1852, Benjamin Gardner company.

Married Ann Hartley 1841 at Burnley (daughter of Barnard Hartley and Mary Beck of Burnley), who was born July 26, 1821. Their children: Martha, d. child; Sarah, m. High priest; missionary to Iron Co., Utah, 1852-56; ward teacher. Road supervisor. Farmer. Died Oct. 11, 1899, at Riverside, Millard Co., Utah.

GREENWOOD, BARNARD HARTLEY (son of William Greenwood and Ann Hartley). Born Sept. 9, 1849, at Warsaw, Ill. Came to Utah July, 1852.

Married Eunice Howd Dec. 19, 1871, Beaver City, Utah (daughter of Simeon F. Howd and Lucinda Morgan—former pioneer July 24, 1847, and latter Sept. 1847). She was born Aug. 8, 1852, at Beaver City. Their children: Hartley b. March 13, 1873, m. Bertha Hawley; Rachel b. June 6, 1875, m. Wing Ence; Amelia b. Feb. 7, 1878, and Adelia b. Feb. 7, 1878, d. infants; Carlos b. Oct. 31, 1879, m. High priest; bishop Inverury ward 1882-1906. Sevier county selectman 1883-90; representative two terms in state legislature, 1896-99. Director in Elsinore Roller Mills Co., Sevier Valley Canal Co. and Richfield Canal Co. Died June 27, 1906.

DEATH OF ANOTHER VETERAN.

Life and Letters of Elder William Greenwood, of American Fork.

William Greenwood was born August 7th, 1822, at Barnaby, Lincolnshire, England, his parents being Robinson Greenwood and Elizabeth Cray Greenwood. Brother Greenwood was reared in the midst of plenty and in a large city which was characterized by the abominations of vice and sin incident to human beings. His naturally sober, serious and religious inclination, in connection with the teachings of kind and devout parents, served as a strong protection against the participation in the vice and vices surrounding his early boyhood. His other habits and constant applications in industrial and professional ways indeed his father to make a confidant of him in his extensive milline business.

A religious inclination and spiritual year of mind led to a condition of the mind and correct condition of man, and an imaginary view of the many jarring and conflicting sects and denominations in the world. This meditation and view inspired a prayerful disposition to know the true Gospel of Christ. Almost immediately an opportunity to hear the Elders of the Mormon Church preach was afforded. The doctrines and principles enunciated seemed to satisfy that longing, and in very short proved to be the much sought for knowledge.

Brother Greenwood, after having been thoroughly convinced by an investigation and perusal of the scriptures and the inspiration of God, was inducted by inspiration into the Church of Jesus Christ, November 29, 1840, at 1 1/2 p. m., by Elder Roger Dewhurst. His acceptance of the gospel was a sufficient cause to induce his father to leave him, not only from his confidence but from his house. In order to see the nature and manner of that banishment the following lines are quoted from Elder Greenwood's journal: "I returned home (that is shortly after baptism) and remained some two or three weeks. During this time all manner of evil reports was carried to my father, inasmuch that he lambasted me again from his house. It seemed wrong that I possessed the spirit of the latter-day work. I had no friends in this world, and it seems all the powers of earth and hell were combined against those who brought the Gospel as revealed to Joseph Smith. I again returned to my brother John and was treated kindly. In the meantime I paid a visit to my father, but the same cruel treatment was meted out to me. My brother Robinson, while I was in my father's house, took a horse-whip and whipped me out of doors." Deceased embarked on the ship *Hannover*, at Liverpool, March 12, 1842, and after a prosperous and pleasant voyage landed in New Orleans, April 13, 1842.

Immediately by steamer he proceeded to the city of Nauvoo, arriving May 15. Fourteen days after arrival he was seized with a dreadful disease. He was gradually restored to strength by the ministrations of the Elders, among whom were Brothers John Taylor and Brigham Young. The following remarkable circumstance is recorded: "And at one time a holy angel from the mansion of

glory administered unto me. The number of the time took me by the hand, as he stood before me and told me who he was, and it seemed I had known him before. The brightness of his person was above the splendor of the sun at noon day. His words, though simple and easily to be understood, such was their power they ran through every vein and part of my body. Neither tongue nor language can describe this, only can it be known by those who pass through it; and few it is that many words of comfort, consolation and promise were given to me which have been fulfilled."

The affliction was endured without a murmur in the midst of a scarcity of the common necessities of life, with an acknowledgment of the protection of the God of Heaven from apostasy and death.

On September 25th, 1842, Elder Greenwood commenced, in company with James Edwards, a mission in Western Territory. After performing his mission by proclaiming the message of salvation to many, he returned to Nauvoo. From there he proceeded to St. Louisport. At the place he met a number of his old associates, among whom was the family of William Houghton. On May 20th, 1843, William Greenwood was married to Alice Houghton, daughter of William Houghton.

On the 17th of June, 1843, in company with his wife, he started for England to procure the sum of \$3000 left him at the death of his father. After getting possession of about \$6000 he returned to American Fork, Jan. 14, 1844. Sometime after his arrival in America he returned to Devonsport, the home of his wife's parents. He purchased a tract of land across adjoining the city of Devonsport. At every available opportunity he joined with the Saints during their sojournings and possessions in the trying times of Nauvoo, and rendered every assistance possible by way of means to the leaders of the church. In the face of much opposition from his wife's relatives—who, at that time, had separated from the church—he remained steadfast with the people of God, disposing of his farm at Devonsport, and making general preparations to move to the unknown West with the Latter-day Saints. Brother and Sister Greenwood received their endowments in the Temple at Nauvoo, January, 1845, on February 6th received the sealing of the new and everlasting covenant; were adopted into the family of President Brigham Young (October 9, 1845), and was ordained a Seventy in the 31st quorum of Seventies.

In reference to the memorable exodus of the Mormons from the States the following is copied from Brother Greenwood's journal: "As soon as the spring of 1847 dawned preparations were commenced for the journey to the West. A majority of the quorum of the Twelve with many others were in readiness to start by the 1st of April, 1847. Their course was westward. Their object was to find a place that the Saints might have possession of their own and be for ever a united people. As ever since the first introduction of the Gospel Joseph and his brethren were like the deer on the mountains and our feet were continually on the alert, their hopes were new that we would go into the wilderness and there perish with hunger. Away went the noble band of pioneers trusting in God to lead them, few in number, seeking for a country they

know not where. In May, 1847, I started down the river with some two or three to obtain an outfit preparatory to following the pioneers. I exchanged considerable property such as clothing, watch, etc. I was blessed in the middle of June, 1847, I left my little home that I had wintered in and felt full of the faith of the most high God. I joined the main camp on the Horn River, there being about 300 wagons, teams, cows, etc. We traveled up the Plat River in companies of 50 and 100 wagons, having captains over tens, fifties and hundreds. Sometimes all the wagons would be in sight at one time. It truly was a wonder to all, and could our forefathers have seen us, they certainly would have acknowledged we deserved salvation, temporal and eternal, to see hundreds of men, women and children rejoicing to have houses and lands which they had bought and paid for, trusting in God to bring us safe through to our journey's end."

The record goes on: "We continued our journey over the deserts, high mountains, following the track of the Pioneers. That path was almost, in places, impassable. Going through narrow passes of the mountains, at last we burst forth in an open space—a beautiful valley, the place where God's servants have led the way by inspiration, a plain apart from our foes. On October 23, 1847, we arrived at the Old Fort, Salt Lake City—a day ever to be remembered by me and my wife Alice, who had to carry, in many places, because of the dangerous road in the mountains, her two little children; a burden endured without utterance of complaint, but rejoicing in tribulation."

Brother Greenwood remained in Salt Lake City until 1861. He was conspicuously identified with the growth and development of this city up to his departure therefrom. Leaving this place he moved to American Fork. He built one of the first houses on the steam, and by his physical, moral and intellectual energies assisted in the settlement and development of American Fork, financially, socially, morally and intellectually.

July 1st, 1860, he was chosen counselor to Bishop L. E. Harrington and remained in that position until the death of Bishop Harrington.

In company with Elders John Hindley and Washburn Chipman, he in 1871 performed a mission to the United States, returning September 25th, 1872. On September 4th, 1871, he started on a mission to England, returning home in March, 1873. On March 24th, 1874, he was ordained a High Priest by President A. G. Snow, and on the reorganization of the Bishopric he was again chosen as counselor to Bishop W. M. Bromley.

Some two years prior to his death, a dreadful disease prevalent in this region of country, caused by the mineral in the water, fastened upon him and continued until it wore him away, inch by inch. On Monday, January 20, 1891, at 7 P. M. he succumbed to his numerous faculty around him, to close his eyes in death.

During his many days and long weary nights of constant and continual pain and suffering a murmur never passed his lips. He bore his burden with the patience of Job, the courage of Pinel, the love of John the beloved, and the faith of Abraham.

He was the father of nineteen children, fifteen of whom survive him. He was also the grandfather of sixty-four grand-children, fifty-one of whom are still alive.
